## **Hon'ble VC Prof. SA Kori Meets Hon'ble President of India Srimati Droupadi Murmu**

Central University of Andhra Pradesh Vice Chancellor Prof. S.A. Kori called on Hon'ble President of India Srimati Droupadi Murmu, Visitor of the University, on 13 April 2023 at Rashtrapati Bhavan in New Delhi. Prof. Kori apprised the Hon'ble President of the progress of the University established at Ananthapuramu in 2018-19 as promised by Government of India to fulfil the aspirations of the people of Andhra Pradesh on the eve of the bifurcation of the erstwhile composite state of Andhra Pradesh into Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. The following points were brought to the notice of the Hon'ble President.

- At present the University has more than 500 students from 21 Indian States and construction work is in progress on its permanent campus at Jantahluru, Ananthapuramu. The Vice Chancellor presented a copy of the master plan of the new upcoming state-of-the-art smart campus to Hon'ble President.
- With the support of ISRO, the University is planning to set up an Observatory Centre on its upcoming permanent campus. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor requested DRDO to set up a Centre of Excellence by way of an Incubation Centre at CUAP to conduct research on prototype fuel cells and nano battery sensors and offer training to dropouts.
- The University also proposes to establish hostels for SC and OBC students with support from the Ministry of Social Welfare and Justice and a hostel for ST students with support from the Ministry of Tribal Affairs.
- Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, and STI Hub (Science Technology and Innovation) are working with CUAP on creating awareness among the vulnerable groups in rural areas about use of pesticides and agriculture marketing and imparting basic computer knowledge by establishing a centre for outreach activities. The proposed Sports Centre too will boost sports activity in the region.
- The University made a thorough study of NEP 2020 and brought in appropriate changes in its curricula in accordance with the requirements of the Policy.
- The University conducted two major surveys for Government of Andhra Pradesh, the first on the Girl Child and the second on the Boya (Valmiki) Community in the region.
- The University hosted an insightful discussion on the book "Modi@20: Dreams Meet Delivery" on 4 August 2022. Chief Guest Smt. Annpurna Devi, Hon'ble Union Minister of State, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, and Guests of Honour Shri A.S. Kiran Kumar, Padma Shree awardee and former Chairman ISRO, and Smt. Shobhana Kamineni, Vice Chairperson of Apollo Hospitals, addressed the participants. The students and teachers actively participated in the discussion.
- The Central University of Andhra Pradesh has adopted six villages under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. Under the Ek Bharat Sresht Bharat programme, it has signed an MoU with the Central University of Punjab and has successfully got two anthologies of Telugu poems translated into Punjabi with three more in the pipeline. The University also conducted a series of programmes as part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav including a "Har Ghar Tiranga" programme in Jantahluru and Reddipalli, two of the villages adopted by the University, a poster exhibition "Wall of Horrors" commemorating "Partition Horrors Remembrance Day," a second one on India's Freedom Struggle, and another on "Electoral Participation and Political Empowerment." In addition, a seminar "Preamble, People, Politics" was also organized. The students and staff also conducted a flag march from the Clock Tower to the Municipal Office at Ananthapuramu town which was highly appreciated by the public and received widespread coverage in the media.

Hon'ble President appreciated Prof. S.A. Kori and his proactive efforts to make CUAP an HEI of excellence.

## **G20 Presidency: India's Re-emergence as a Vishwa Guru**

India sees its G20 Presidency as a catalyst for change and transformation of the world, a world stricken by multi-dimensional crises, such as food and energy security, which have been accentuated by geopolitical tensions. At a time when the world is mired in conflicts that jeopardise the lives of ordinary people, India will harness its G20 Presidency to forge constructive and consensus-based solutions to a host of challenges such as reviving global growth, stronger climate action, and robust global health architecture. As part of its Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, India celebrates its remarkable progress in many fields. From record agricultural production to advancements in nuclear and space technology, from ensuring affordable healthcare to setting up world-class educational institutions, from ayurveda to biotechnology, from establishing giant steel plants to becoming an IT power and having the third biggest startup ecosystem in the world – India's success has been phenomenal. Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are an integral part of India's development agenda and its belief in an interconnected world, as epitomised in ethos of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam," the ethos which animates India's G20 Presidency. As our Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji stated, "India's G20 Presidency will work to promote this universal sense of oneness. Hence our theme – 'One Earth, One Family, One Future.'" Shri Narendra Modi ji further envisions India's G20 agenda to be "inclusive, ambitious, action-oriented, and decisive." Thus, India's G20 Presidency offers it an opportunity to steer the world toward inclusive and sustainable growth. India played a pivotal role in the formulation of the United Nations Agenda 2030 and much of the country's National Development Agenda is mirrored in the SDGs. In this sense, the progress of the world to meet the SDGs largely depends on India's progress. And India's successes and experiences are critically important to tailoring global solutions.

In a world fragmented by polarising conflicts and decline of global institutions, the G20, which represents 85% of global GDP, 75% of international trade, and two-thirds of the world's population, will become more important than ever before. India, as G20 President, will

seek to bolster the G20's status and authority as the premier global forum for cooperation on global economic and financial issues. A fact to be remembered is that the G20 was born at the height of the 2008 financial meltdown, which compelled the world to set up a new representative multilateral grouping comprising developed and emerging economies. It is in this context that Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji affirms, "...the world is looking at the G20 with hope." Promoting food and nutrition security will be an important priority as the COVID-19 pandemic has pushed millions of people into poverty. India focuses on fast-tracking the Sustainable Development Goals and leading the world to adopt an eco-friendly sustainable lifestyle. With its core strength in information technology, India focuses on making digital architecture inclusive so that it can become a catalyst for socio-economic transformation. Promoting inclusive growth and development, with focus on inclusive finance, will be a key priority. Energy is an area of priority in India's G20 Presidency. To advance energy transition, India supports transformation and diversification of energy systems for accelerating and ensuring clean, sustainable, and affordable energy transitions. In this regard, India advocates continued support for developing countries, especially the most vulnerable ones, in terms of providing access to affordable, reliable, sustainable, and modern energy, capacity building, affordable latest technology within the public domain, mutually beneficial technology cooperation, and financing mitigation actions in the energy sector. India also focuses on making digital architecture inclusive so that it can become a catalyst for socio-economic transformation. Digital transformation is the key to achieving scale and speed in critical areas including promoting transparency in governance.

With regard to climate change, at the Global Climate Summit COP15 in Copenhagen in 2009, developed countries had committed to jointly mobilising US\$100 billion per year by 2020 to help developing countries tackle the effects of climate change. But more than 14 years later, this target has only been partially met. Against this backdrop, fast-tracking delivery of climate finance and raising the ambition for climate finance will be a high priority for India's G20 Presidency. In

India's view, developing countries require substantive enhancement in climate finance from the floor of US\$100 billion per year to meet their ambitious goals, and rich countries need to lead the mobilisation of resources.

In conclusion, India's first priority in the coming years will be to internally consolidate its capabilities on a more sustained basis so that it can stand up to Beijing's nefarious designs. This will have to be supplemented by building serious partnerships that are capable of adding value to India's growth story. India's G20 Presidency will be aiming to move the world away from polarisation towards a greater sense of solidarity. Its own reality of being a multicultural democracy should guide it well in bringing together highly diverse stakeholders to cogitate and act on global challenges. This is an inflection point for the global order and for India. India is on the cusp of achieving something dramatic: not only as a top-tier economic power that is also a multicultural democracy but also a top-tier geopolitical player that can lead, not simply balance. The choices that India will make over the next few years will define the contours of that rise.

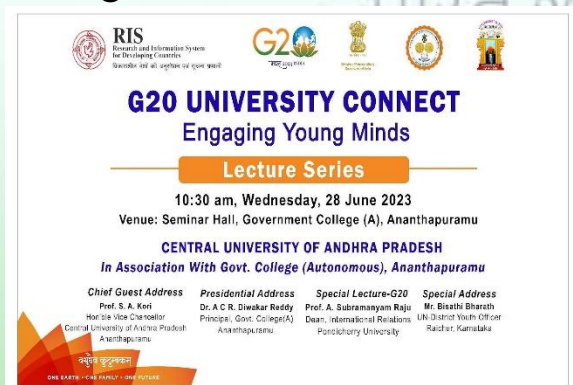

Central University of Andhra Pradesh, Ananthapuramu, in collaboration with Research and Information System for Developing Countries (RIS), New Delhi and in association with Government College (Autonomous), Ananthapuramu, organized a Special Lecture on G20 Indian Presidency on 28th June, 2023 at Government College (A), Ananthapuramu under G20 University Connect program. The theme is “G20 University Connect: Engaging Young Minds”

Representatives from some civic societies like Rotary Club and community organizations attended the program.

### Coverage

The deliberations covered a wide spectrum of issues ranging from regional cooperation and cultural exchange programs to climate change and global terrorism. The range of issues included challenges of national and international concern, particularly issues related to all members of G20 Group.



### Gist of the Deliberations

In his address as Chief Guest, Prof. S.A. Kori, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Central University of Andhra Pradesh, Ananthapuramu spoke on the progress achieved by G20 in

general, and India in particular, in different spheres in the last decade. India, he observed, gives importance to sustainable goals such as greenhouse emission, gender equality, responsible production and consumption of resources. He stressed the need for peace and justice and wellbeing of all sections in the Indian society. He pointed out that digital transformation makes India a truly advanced nation. Speaking of holistic education, Prof. Kori, pointed out that experiential learning was emphasized in



ancient Indian Gurukula system of education. Now the priorities are different, and as such, digital learning has become the need of the hour. Prof. A Subramanyam Raju, Dean, International Relations, Pondicherry University delivered the G20 Special Lecture. He highlighted

the proactive role being played by India as a catalyst of change and global transformation in a world which is facing challenges like geo political tensions, border conflicts as at Doklam, climate change and global terrorism. He contended that the major focus areas are sustainable development, digital transformation, biodiversity and inclusive growth. G20 provides India with an opportunity to scale new heights of excellence. India is striving to be a role model in transforming the world into *Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam* (One Earth, One Family, One Future). There are limitations but the goal is achievable. He observed that India's destiny is common destiny. It is time to reconnect and navigate ourselves. He stressed the role of youth in shaping the future of India. Prof. Raju was optimistic that India, as a living model, would leave an indelible mark on G20 process in creating a more inclusive and equitable world. Dr. A.C.R. Diwakar Reddy, Principal, Government College,

(A), Ananthpuramu, delivered the Presidential Address. He pointed out that crucial sectors are health, environment and finance. G20 countries decide how to sustain development activities in the key domains of climate, health, etc. He stressed the need for greater participation of the youth in the dynamic phenomenon of change. Mr. Bisathi Bharath, UN-District Youth Officer, Raichur, Karnataka, delivered the Special Address. He spoke of the prominence and dynamics of G20 and the role of India. India is a leader for both the developing and developed countries. India has succeeded in converting a crisis (during Covid-19) into an opportunity. India is leading in the domain of digital payments. He observed that organic farming enables us to reestablish the link with nature. India has emerged as Global South leader. He pointed out that India is a pioneer in renewable resources. His lecture ended on an optimistic note that a lot has been achieved but still a lot remains to be done.



## Students' Interaction

After deliberations, queries were invited from the students. Students raised relevant and thought provoking issues. Mahima, a student of Govt. College (A), Ananthapuramu, asked whether it is possible to maintain good and cordial relations with different countries in G-20. Mr. Bharath answered in the affirmative and India has been doing it successfully. Almas Fatma, a student of Central University of Andhra Pradesh, asked whether leadership of India would not lead to hegemony. Prof. A.Subramanya Raju, answered that India will never take advantage of a situation and dictate terms to member countries. Thus, the interaction between young, ignited minds and intellectuals on the dais was fruitful.

**Collage (Local Media Coverage, Social Media Activity etc.)**

The event received wide publicity Newspapers in

regional language (Telugu) like *Eenadu* and *Andhra Jyothi* and English dailies like *The Hans India* gave extensive coverage to the programme. The report was also posted on the official website of Central University of Andhra Pradesh. The programme was also telecast live on You Tube. Programs were conducted before G-20 Special Lecture. Central University of Andhra Pradesh, Ananthapuramu organized a Quiz contest for the students of Central University of Andhra Pradesh. A preliminary round was conducted on 14th June, 2023. Eighty-one students participated with enthusiasm. Fifteen students who qualified, took part in the main round of quiz contest on 15th June, 2023. Questions were asked on G-20, Geography, History, Economy, Polity and Current Affairs. The session was exciting as students took part

with zeal. Elocution Competition was conducted on 20th June 2023 at Govt. College

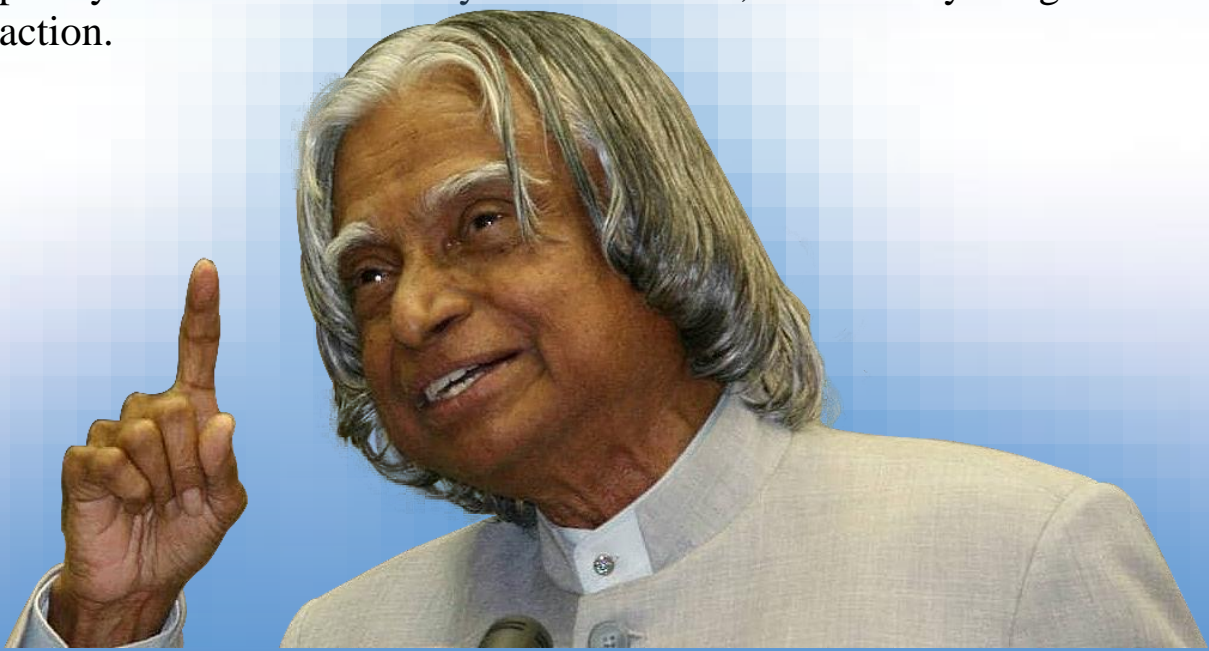

## Dr. A P J Abdul Kalam's Speech On Education

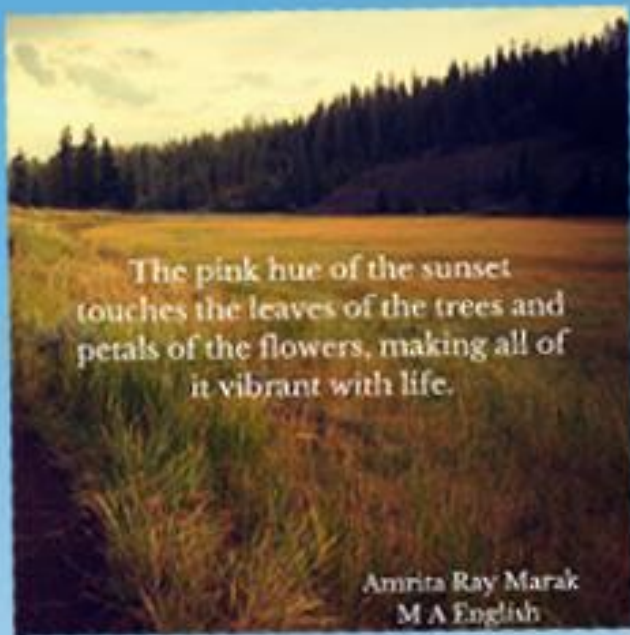
I would like to recall one incident, which occurred during my childhood (Age 10). Each day when I returned home from my school in the evening, my father would have gone to namaz And my mother would be performing namaz and look angelic. After Thakbhir position, she will recite two suras from Holy Quran. One starts with Alhamdhu, and the other “Lakkum, Theenukum”. One day I asked my parents what is the meaning of Lakkum Theenukum?
